25th June: Drawing Competition:-



"O Soul, thou at rest return to the lord at peace with him, and be at peace with you."





In addition to the sundials and clock, the Jantar Mantar also has several other intriguing instruments.

One is the Jai Prakash yantra, which can measure the position of stars and planets with great accuracy. Another is the Rama yantra, which allows the observer to measure the altitude of celestial bodies. It's hard to believe that our ancestors could create something so grand. We were quite surprised to see Jantar Mantar. It was mind blowing. After visiting Jantar Mantar, we went for shopping at 12:30 PM and had our lunch.






11 PM and had dinner.






The Virtue of Kindness


सच्ची मित्रता

सोशल मीडिया में व्यस्त रहने के कारण वे अपने माता-पिता, भाई-बहन एवं घर के बाकी सदस्यों से दूर हो गए हैं। एक ही घर में रहकर घरवाले अनजान तथा अनजान लोगों को अपना समझने की भूल कर रहे हैं। कई बार छात्र अपनी निजी जानकारियाँ सोशल मीडिया में साझा कर खुद के लिए मुसीबत मोल लेते हैं। इसी सोशल मीडिया के कारण छात्रों में आउटडोर गेम्स को लेकर आकर्षण नहीं है। छात्रों में आत्मानुभावों की कमी के कारण फर्जी जानकारी प्राप्त कर गलत कामों में पड़ रहे हैं। गलत आदतें लग रही हैं। शारीरिक विकास के साथ साथ उनके मानसिक विकास पर भी इसका गलत प्रभाव पड रहा है जिस कारण से पढ़ने लिखने में मन नहीं लग पा रहा है। छात्रों के स्मरण शक्ति भी दिन व दिन कमजोर होती जा रही है। छात्र अपना ज्यादातर समय सोशल मीडिया पर बर्बाद कर रहे हैं जिसके कारण वे अन्य कार्यों में समय नहीं दे पाते हैं। यही कारण है कि अभी की युवा पीढ़ी में स्वाध्याय, लगन और खेलकूद तथा संस्कारों में भी कमी आ रही है और अनेक गंभीर समस्याएँ पैदा हो रही हैं। हमारे छात्रवर्ग ही हमारे देश के भावी भविष्य निधि हैं, वे देश की अर्थव्यवस्था को बना भी सकते हैं और बिगाड़ भी सकते हैं। सोशल नेटवर्क वेबसाइट पर लोगों का मानक विचार है कि अगर आप डिजिटल रूप से


